I am writing to request leniency at the sentencing for Neal Erickson. I have known Neal

professionally and personally throughout the 17 years he taught at RCMS.

I realize and accept the fact that Neal has made an egregious mistake and ruined his career of teaching. However, Neal is, was, and always will be a good, kind, responsible, hardworking person. He has been a great addition to the community and especially to RCMS. We worked together on many projects. We shared responsibility for RCMS Bands, marching in the Rose City July 4th parade and performing for the Rose City VFW Memorial Day Service. We have played Taps at military funerals.
